Lincoln Park Zoo

Located in a beautiful wooded park setting Lincoln Park Zoo features animals and birds native to the North Woods. See prairie dogs, bobcats, cougars, bison and raptors as you walk through a natural setting designed to make you and the animals comfortable. Come early and witness young salmon or trout in a feeding frenzy at the holding pond. The Animal Care and Education Building features a rain forest

habitat and exotic, tropical, and native fish. Playground and picnic areas by the river. Butterflies and wildflowers seasonal. New petting farm for the kids!

Woodland Dunes Nature Center & Preserve

Woodland Dunes is located near an ecological "tension zone" between two distinct areas of natural vegetation in Wisconsin. Both northern and southern species of plants and animals are found here. Woodland Dunes offers six trails that allow visitors to explore the 1,200 acre preserve that includes woodlands, meadows and marshes. Two of the trails, Cattail and Yellow Birch, are wheelchair accessible boardwalks. For the adventure seekers, Woodland Dunes has 6 geocaches located along the trails. Learn about this remarkable wild area and explore the interpretive center, butterfly garden, boardwalks and Little Wings natural playground.

Point Beach State Forest

Located on 6 miles of pristine Lake Michigan coastline, this 3,000 acre forest has many activities to offer visitors. Enjoy camping, swimming, bike trails, Lighthouse viewing, horseback riding on the new horse trails, hiking, and hunting. Or visit the Nature Center.

During the summer season, a private concessionaire is available in the Lodge Building on the north end of the campground.
